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## **Executive Summary**

#### District Strategic Plan 2025

Orange County Public Schools is the ninth-largest school district in the United States and the fourth largest in Florida. The district serves more than 206,000 students at 202 schools and is one of the largest employers in Central Florida with more than 25,000 team members.

**Vision:** To ensure every student has a promising and successful future.

**Mission:** With the support of families and the community, we create enriching and diverse pathways to lead our students to success.

#### School Collection Development Plan

Pineloch Elementary School serves 860 students enrolled in Kindergarten through fifth grades. The student population's ethnicity is made up of 31% Hispanic and 69% Non-Hispanic students. Additionally, we serve a diverse population made up of 29% White, 67% Black, 0% Native, 1% Asian, 0% Pacific, and 3% Multicultural students.

The administration includes Principal Gerai Mays and Assistant Principal Dr. Maria Gaspar. Pineloch Elementary School is proud to offer the many special programs which provide students with opportunities.

A thorough analysis of the current media center collection at Pineloch Elementary School indicates that the average age of the collection is 2008 and the number of books per student is 14. The <u>American Association for School Libraries</u> has established a criteria for a highly effective media center that includes a ratio of 15-20 books available per student in the collection. At this time, Pineloch Elementary School does not meet the recommended standards for the number of books per student.

The analysis of the collection also revealed the following areas of strengths and concerns:

- The average publication date of 2008 is acceptable but needs improvement.
- This collection is in need of newer non-fiction books.
- This collection contains 3.246 Diverse Titles.
- Weeding will focus on the OCPS Catalog Project and aged titles in the Non-Fiction section.
- Purchasing of new books will focus on Graphic Novels and lower level reading books.

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## **Representation Analysis**

To deepen focus on strategic collection development, specific sections of the collection were analyzed in detail to determine whether the media center collection reflects and represents various points of view and experiences. Based on the available school data of Pineloch Elementary School in comparison to Collection Analysis results, it was found that:
